### **Guest Preacher today: Jason Smith from the Alliance of Baptists**

Rev. Jason Smith is preaching for us in today's service. He serves as a Congregational Engagement Specialist with the Alliance of Baptists, focusing on development and fundraising strategy. He is an Adjunct Professor in the Sutton School of Social Sciences with Ouachita Baptist University.

Jason grew up in Costa Rica, where his parents served as Baptist missionaries, and continues to be involved in special projects collaborating with communities of faith in Latin America. He co-led intercultural immersion projects to El Salvador in 2011 and 2012 with mentor and hero, Rev. Edgar Palacios. In 2014, he served as a New Testament instructor with Baptist churches in the Guna Yala indigenous province of Panama through the Latino Network of Virginia Baptists. He serves as an interpreter/translator with the Church at Ponce and Highland in Atlanta visiting the Mayan Intercultural Seminary in San Cristobal, Chiapas, Mexico in 2017, 2018, and 2019; these groups are partnering with Tzotzil churches in central Chiapas to develop an agricultural/livestock cooperative.

Jason and his wife Myra live in Arkadelphia, Arkansas, where Myra is Assistant Professor of History at Ouachita Baptist University with an emphasis on contemporary southern African legal and constitutional history. They share their home with three dogs Coco, Bogey, and Teddy. Jason says, "I look forward to sharing my gifts of fundraising/development, ministry in an intercultural environment, and experience living in Latin America with the organization as it grows, thrives, and continues dismantling barriers, bringing God's children together in beloved community."

## Ways to Help Labyrinth Progressive Student Ministries

Though this year will certainly look different, Labyrinth has begun their fall programming. Their weekly schedule includes worship at 6pm on Sundays, Bible study at 6pm on Wednesdays, and Happy Hour and Meditation on Thursdays starting at 5pm. These events, plus extra social events and outreach efforts, will be a mix of online and outdoors with an emphasis on keeping the community healthy and connected.

Even amidst a pandemic, Labyrinth will find ways to have community meals so that no student faces food insecurity. This will primarily mean stocking the kitchen with single-serve meals, snacks, and ingredients for students to take home or eat outside together. You can help! Anna and Rene would love donations of the following:

- Single-serve convenience meals (*frozen burritos, Hot Pockets, frozen waffles, mini pizzas, frozen meals, ramen, mini cereal boxes, boxed soymilk, tuna packets*)
- Pre-portioned, individually packaged home-cooked meals (*baked potatoes or tacos wrapped in foil, casserole servings in tupperware, soups in mason jars, etc.*)
- Individually packaged snacks (*pudding cups, granola bars, cheese sticks, raisins, peanut butter/cheese crackers, chips, etc.*)
- Individual drinks in cans or bottles (*cold brew coffee, Frappuccinos, iced tea, sodas, kombucha, juice, etc.*)
- Lunch sacks decorated with notes of encouragement
